Guidelines for submission of a project idea

Introduction

This document provides detailed guidelines for submitting a project idea for community level grant funding under the Sustainable Forest Livelihoods (SFL) Programme. It outlines who can apply, what types of activities are eligible for support, the selection criteria, funding categories, and the submission process.

The SFL Programme is funded by the European Union, implemented by the French Development Agency (AFD), and executed in Suriname and Guyana by WWF-Guianas. The programme's main objective is to conserve healthy forests and natural resources by supporting alternative and sustainable livelihoods in forest-dependent communities.

In Suriname, the programme focuses in the Para and Upper Suriname regions; in Guyana, it targets Administrative Regions 2 and 10. The community level grants are intended to strengthen sustainable livelihoods in Indigenous and local communities by supporting initiatives related to the **timber** and **nature-based tourism** value chains.

This call for project ideas is the first step in a two-phase application process. Only applicants whose ideas are selected will be invited to and supported to develop and submit a full proposal. All applicants are encouraged to read this document carefully before preparing their submission.











1. Purpose of the Grants

For whom?

One of the criteria is that applicants must fall under one of the following categories:

- Village Councils
- Established groups within Indigenous or tribal villages
- Community-level entrepreneurs or micro/small enterprises
- Local non-governmental organizations
- Community-based organizations
- Co-operatives
- Community Forestry Organizations (CFOs)

Duration: This call for project ideas will be open from July 9, 2025 to September 30, 2025. Project ideas must be executable within 12 months.

2. Eligable activities

The grants are intended to support activities that contribute to the sustainable development of the timber and the naturebased tourism value chain.

Eligible activities may include, but are not limited to:

Equipment and small infrastructure:

- **Timber value chain:** For sustainable logging, strengthen wood processing, wood crafting activities, Use wood waste.
- **Nature-based tourism value chain**: For developing and strengthening nature-based tourism, accommodation, tourism services, transport.

Training and Coaching:

- Timber value chain: Reduced Impact Logging, FSC/ PEFC certification, wood processing techniques, maintenance and handling of equipment,
- Nature-based tourism value chain: Product development, bird-watching, catering, marketing
- **Both value chains:** capacity building for marketing and branding, health and safety, business development











3. Selection criteria

The project ideas will be evaluated by a selection panel and scored based on the following criteria

RELEVANCY	To the objectives of the SFL-programme.		
CLARITY	The project idea is clear and focused enough. (Example: the idea "developing tourism products and a corresponding marketing strategy for an existing ecolodge in village x" is much more concrete then "developing tourism in village X)		
FEASIBILITY	The practicality of the project and its ability to achieve the proposed objectives within the timeline.		
COMMUNITY IMPACT	Extent to which community members may be positively impacted by the proposed activities.		
CAPABILITY of the applicant	Current/past experience with the value chain, existing assets or skills within the value chain, Track record of managing projects of a similar nature.		
ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY	Consideration of any risks related to environmental and social impacts.		
SUSTAINABILITY	The long-term impact of the project and its ability to continue after the grant period.		











Additional eligibility criteria:

- The same applicant can apply 1 time for the timber value chain and 1 time for the tourism value chain. If there are multiple ideas for one of the value chains, all ideas need to be reflected in the project concept note being submitted. Once a concept note is successfully selected for development of a full proposal the scope of work will be refined.
- Applicants must originate from an organization, business or individual based within an indigenous village or local community within the Administrative Regions two or ten in Guyana / Para and Boven Suriname.
- Optional (if relevant) to provide a letter of support from the Village Council /Village Leadership (or similar applicable local government body). The letter of support will indicate that support is provided in line with legal requirements applicable in the country (e.g. consent at a Village General meeting or a general meeting convened by CFOs). (Annex 3)

4. Grant sizes

Grant types	Category	Ticket sizes (USD)
	Small	10,000 – 25,000
Full proposals	Medium	25,000 – 50,000
	Large*	50,000 - 120,000

(*) The number of Grants awarded in the large grant category will be less compared to the other categories. Considering that the selection will be highly competitive and grantees will need to strongly demonstrate their capacity to implement, make a strong business case and provide supporting documentation requested by the funders.

The final grant amount will depend on the size, scope, and impact of the proposed project. It will be defined after the selection process, during the developing phase of the proposals.











6. How to apply?

By answering the questions in the project idea template attached to these guidelines for project ideas. This can be done:

7. Next steps

The applicants will be informed about the status of the project ideas, at most one (1) month after the closure of the deadline.

- Successful applicants at the project idea stage will be supported, if required, by a consultant to develop their full proposal.
- Applicants must not submit full proposals before submission and selection of project ideas.



The grant will only be issued after the successful completion and acceptance of the full proposal. The further steps and expected durations of each step are shown in the flow diagram in Annex 1.










Annex 1
